# Current Healthy Campus & Community Initiatives:

A multi-media **Social Norms campaign** will begin this Spring, designed to challenge the dominant narrative that "everybody parties," with images of students enjoying healthy activities on campus and in the community.

More than 75 college staff and students have been trained in **Motivational Interviewing**, a non-judgmental approach to holding conversations about substance use with students and friends.

A work group is beginning to develop a support program for **students in recovery** from substance use and mental health challenges as well as students who choose a substance-free lifestyle.

The coalition is beginning the process of looking at **sustainability** beyond June 2022 when our current NYS Environmental Prevention grant ends.

More students are getting involved in the Healthy Campus and Community Coalition, as are community members. We look forward to organizing **outdoor campus and village activities** to welcome students to the coming Fall semester.

Our AOD Interns have developed a long list of "Things to Do in Western NY" to encourage students to get out of the dorms and into the community and surrounding places of interest and recreation, from Buffalo to Rochester and everywhere inbetween.
